The Use of ICT Devices Among Pupils and Students

The use of computers and the Internet is becoming part of the life of youth at increasingly earlier stages of life. In 2005, nearly half of the students in our college had no Internet access in their homes, and only an average of 50% of them used it on a daily basis. Today, the same indicators are substantially higher even in the case of primary school-aged children. It is, therefore, necessary for educational institutions to keep up with technical developments in order to be able to take part in the development of informational literacy.

The Structure Formation of Professional Training in a Multiethnic Border Region

The purpose of the present paper is to investigate the factors that influence the educational structure and labor market mobility of residents living along the

Serbian-Hungarian border, with special emphasis on Hungarian minorities living in Serbia. The young residents prove to be mobile during their career building processes and plan their cross-border commute. It is crucial to monitor the labor market demands, i.e. whether employers are content with the labor market supply. In order to reveal this question, employers were surveyed.

The research shows that the cross-border institutionally organized network contact is inadequate in the Serbian-Hungarian border region. With the purpose of raising the educational level of residents the (Hungarian-Hungarian and Hungarian-Serbian) institutional co-operation should be reevaluated. The training institutions should function as "knowledge-factories", in other words, they should transfer marketable knowledge. The Juhász Gyula Faculty of Education, University of Szeged, contributes to the educational development of the resident living along the Serbian-Hungarian border. There are various educational programs organized that promote various cultural interests, openness and a practice-oriented attitude have contributed to the establishment of new institutional contacts with other partner institutions (teaching also in Hungarian).

Study and Knowledge in Higher Education and Workplaces

In our paper, we analyzed deep interviews conducted with owners and managers of SMEs with the grounded theory method. Our data reveal the experiences of entrepreneurs: the analysis of the interviews indicates that many of the managers are dissatisfied with the competencies of newly graduated colleagues. There are great differences between the knowledge gained in the formal education and the competencies required by the organizations. Our results indicates that the managers were concerned by the absence of the elements of the competences

which formal education could develop in the students if in the pedagogical culture the dominance of behaviorism decreased, giving way to a constructivist perspective.

Participatory Action Research (PAR) – An Alternative Approach to Social Research for Workable Knowledge and Social Change

Participatory action research (PAR) intends to produce workable knowledge and contribute to positive social changes at the same time. Within PAR, researcher and (usually) marginalized non-researcher participants work together for longer periods of time, on a regular basis, in a structured and action-oriented way.

The present study introduces the basics of PAR and its main characteristics, while illustrating this theoretical introduction with practical examples from a PAR process which has been going on for 5 years in Szeged, Hungary, and which the authors are part of as researchers and social activists.

The paper's conclusion is that PAR is a progressive approach for researchers and practitioners in cases they intend to produce workable knowledge and contribute to positive social changes at the same time regarding significant social problems.
